Back for its fourth season, the Dorchester Winter Farmers' Market operates every Friday (note new day). from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., through March 27, in the Great Hall, 6 Norfolk Street in Codman Square. Vendors include Silverbrook Farm, Oakdale Farm, and the Neighborhood Farm (produce); Foxboro Farm (cheese and meat); and Red's Best Seafood. Specialty vendors include Lyndigo Spice (spices, chutneys, and condiments), The Ancient Bakers (plant-based, vegan), Boobee Bread, and Big A Farm (prepared Indonesian food), plus occasional guest vendors; local non-profits also have information tables. Boston Bounty Bucks provides up to \$10 in free produce for SNAP EBT cardholders. Special events and kids' activities make this a festive gathering for everyone. AHCM Concert January 25

Ashmont Hill Chamber Music opens its 2015 season with the Borromeo String Quartet on Sunday, January 25, 3 p.m., in newly-renovated Peabody Hall at All Saints Church, 209 Ashmont Street. The program features Franz Schubert, String Quartet in G major, D. 887; Ludwig van Beethoven, String Quartet, Op. 130; and Beethoven, *Grosse Fuge*, Op. 133.

The Borromeo String Quartet, which includes Nicholas Kitchen and Kristopher Tong (violins), Mai Motobuchi (viola), and Yeesun Kim (cello), is celebrating its twenty-fifth anniversary; considered one of the most important string quartets of our time, the musicians have been the faculty ensemblein-residence at the New England Conservatory of Music for 22 years. They have worked with the Library of Congress, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, and the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, and have performed an extensive repertoire throughout the world.

On Sunday, February 15, at 2 p.m., the Dorchester Historical Society welcomes Carla D. Martin, PhD., Harvard University lecturer, for a sensory exploration of the world of chocolate. Inspired by her popular undergraduate course, this event will introduce the socio-historical legacy of chocolate and the global and ethical issues connected to the production of one of America's favorite sweets, with an emphasis on the eating and appreciation of the socalled "food of the gods." Guided chocolate tasting will be woven throughout the program. Martin confesses to a fixation on chocolate and has done extensive tasting.
