## **September Meeting Notes**

Officer Mike Keaney reported that Part 1 (serious) crimes in the district are generally down, but there has been a slight increase in commercial breakins, including two in Peabody Square (for which there are leads), and in homicides. Discussion re: how the officer who be in the neighborhood for Halloween might interact with trick-ortreaters, also about the possibility of cameras on Ashmont Street...not likely but we could request.

Meg Mack presented the idea of a group of neighbors signing up for weekly delivery of Red's Best Seafood and other items through Evergreen Delivery after the Farmers Market closes. Josh Waxman, executive director of the Martin Richard Foundation, described the foundation's activities, which include supporting youth sports programs and community organizations in Dorchester and beyond. They are already working on plans for the annual One Boston Day next spring. The Foundation is open to requests from community groups for help with projects that align with their mission.

Nino Barbalace, who is opening Zia Gianna Caffe and Bakery in the former Dot2Dot space, described his plans... and brought delicious tiramisu for us to sample. He will be open Tuesday through Sunday, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., serving breakfast and lunch with an Italian/Sicilian focus and a modern, neighborhood atmosphere. He has

applied for a wine and beer license and will consider evening events once he is up and running. He hopes to open by the end of October.


